A Reading from the Old Testament

I Kings 17.8–16

8 Then the word of the Lord came to him, saying,

9 'Go now to Zarephath, which belongs to Sidon, and live there; for I have commanded a widow there to feed you.'

10 So he set out and went to Zarephath. When he came to the gate of the town, a widow was there gathering sticks; he called to her and said, 'Bring me a little water in a vessel, so that I may drink.'

11 As she was going to bring it, he called to her and said, Bring me a morsel of bread in your hand.

12 But she said, As the Lord your God lives, I have nothing baked, only a handful of meal in a jar, and a little oil in a jug; I am now gathering a couple of sticks, so

that I may go home and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it, and die.

13 Elijah said to her, Do not be afraid; go and do as you have said; but first make me a little cake of it and bring it to me, and afterwards make something for yourself and your son.

14 For thus says the Lord the God of Israel: The jar of meal will not be emptied and the jug of oil will not fail until the day that the Lord sends rain on the earth.

15 She went and did as Elijah said, so that she as well as he and her household ate for many days.

16 The jar of meal was not emptied, neither did the jug of oil fail, according to the word of the Lord that he spoke by Elijah.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

John 2.1–11

2 On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there.

2 Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding.

3 When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, They have no wine.

4 And Jesus said to her, Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.

5 His mother said to the servants, Do whatever he tells you.

6 Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons.

7 Jesus said to them, Fill the jars with water. And they filled them up to the brim.

8 He said to them, Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward. So they took it.

9 When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom 10 and said to him, Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.

11 Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

What's happening at St Thomas' Church

Access

The church has been successful in its application for a grant to improve access via the entrance to church and will begin the process of applying for all relevant permissions to install a ramp and automatic opening doors to improve the access for both wheelchair users and parents with pushchairs.

Sustainability

The church has achieved a bronze Eco Church award and is working towards silver and gold awards.

We have also been successful in our application to become a Net Zero Demonstrator Church and will receive a grant to help us to transition to a more sustainable carbon neutral heating system. As part of this transition, we are looking to prevent any water ingress to protect the unique and very special Miller Nicholson Murals. We are looking for

corporate sponsors to help us to raise funds for this important work.
