What's happening at St Thomas' Church

Access

The church has been successful in its application for a grant to improve access via the entrance to church and will begin the process of applying for all relevant permissions to install a ramp and automatic opening doors to improve the access for both wheelchair users and parents with pushchairs.

Sustainability

The church has achieved a bronze Eco Church award and is working towards silver and gold awards. We have also been successful in our application to become a Net Zero Demonstrator Church and will receive a grant to help us to transition to a more sustainable carbon neutral heating system. As part of this transition, we are looking to prevent any water ingress to protect the unique and very special Miller Nicholson Murals.

Target 25

As a Diocese inspired by A

Rocha(Eco Church) each parish is committing to working towards the conservation of two species from a list of 25 endangered groups of species in the Isle of Man working in conjunction with Manx Wildlife Trust, and many other local charities.

At St Thomas' we are committing to working to protect swifts and butterflies. St Thomas' has 3 swift boxes in the church tower and has a device that emits swift calls to encourage swifts to nest there.

Last summer on two separate occasions we saw 4 swifts flying around the church. We also have worked with the Manx Wildlife Trust and Douglas Council previously with our Rainbows groups to grow plants in our Dragonflies Den planters at the entrance to church. We will grow plants to encourage butterflies around the church including some that might be considered weeds but that are good for caterpillars and so are important in the life cycle of butterflies.
