We began by welcoming new members to the PCC and thanking those who have put their names down to be sidespersons. We are always pleased for anyone to step forward and help out at Church in any capacity.

So if you feel you are being called to help the Church thrive and grow, please talk to Rev Liz, Mike or Peter. There's lots of ways in which you can help us to help.

Pam noted that we had raised £500 for the Douglas Coal Fund during Lent lunches and that we have raised £173.21 towards Christian Aid which will be matched by IOM Government contributions.

On the fabric side of things, there are several faculties under way. The cast iron external vent replacements is nearing approval and hopefully this work can be carried out as soon as we possibly can. We are looking at putting a notice board on the walls outside the vestry door on Church walk. This will be used by the Church and the Bookshop. There's also another faculty for moving the Communion table to its position at the foot of the nave. We are also in discussion about re-rendering the external pebble dashed wall and whether this would need a faculty.

We have placed an order for a new dishwasher. This will be placed under the counter next to the sink. It

will mean the removal of the cupboard that is there in order to fit it in situ.

We are very pleased that Pam has stepped into Mandy's safeguarding shoes and placed on record our thanks to both for ensuring that there has been a smooth transition and keeping our gold standard approach to safeguarding. Pam will be in touch with anyone who needs to attend a safeguarding course in due course. Some of these are available on-line so can be done in the comfort of your own home at your own speed.

The summer concerts are now fully booked and we look forward to getting these up and running again. The longest day and longest ride is going ahead this year and Pat has placed sheets for volunteers to sign up to help out at the back of Church.

The 150th anniversary of continual worship at St Thomas is progressing. We expect to be able to put press releases out on what's happening toward the end of TT fortnight.

The most pressing vacancy on the PCC is for Treasurer as Pam has indicated that she will step down at the end of the year. The new person does not need to be a member of the PCC and between now and the end of the year can shadow Pam to help bed in.

Steve Hull was approved as a trainee reader at St Thomas and we wish him all the success in his mission.
