MINISTERS MESSAGE FOR THE MONTH

Dear friends,

As we enter October we enter a season to be thankful as we celebrate Harvest and reflect back on the year behind us and anticipate the journey through All Saints and Remembrance to the Christmas Season.

And this October as in previous years we are holding an October giving month, where people are invited to reflect on God's generosity to us and how we can return some of the great gifts that we have received and review our giving and if we are able to make a generous gift to St Thomas' Church funds.

For people who are newer to the church we have many ways in which to make a donation to church. Many of us don't have ready cash in our pockets and find it easier to arrange to pay things through our bank accounts. This suits out treasurer too who is grateful for a predictable income, and it also means that we do not incur the costs that the banks are threatening small charities with to handle cheques and cash. So rather than putting money into the offertory each month you can pay a monthly standing order to the PCC account. We have cards at the back of church which indicate that you are doing this, and which can be placed onto the collection plate to avoid the awkwardness of looking like you aren't donating anything.

This is also an opportunity to remind people who have started coming to church more recently that we have electoral roll forms at the back of church for anyone wishing to become a regular member of the church.
